This is the white soft neck variety. Great in all types of cooking. To plant split bulbs into cloves when you are ready to plant them. There are about 3 bulbs or 35 cloves in 8 oz of garlic. Plant the same as shallots.

These are the smaller bulbs for planting. There are approximately 8-12 bulbs in an 8 oz box of these shallots. They can be different varieties depending on the season. Plant bulbs about 6" apart in rows are 8" apart so you can hoe and weed easily. Weeding is important, shallots hate to compete with weeds. Plant the depth of the bulb with the bulb's top pointing up. In the winter you could plant the bulbs in a pot on the windowsill and cut the greens off for cooking or in salads.

Shiitake Mushroom Log The Shiitake (she-TAH-kee) mushroom log is an all natural product, organic ready to fruit hardwood log that has been inoculated with high quality shiitake spawn and incubated for 8-12 months. It will grow mushrooms every two months for about four years. A log usually produces about 1/4 to 1/3 pound of shiitakes at first and yields increasingly larger crops with each fruiting. Eventually, the log can be covered top-to-bottom with mushrooms. Harvests taper off in last year as the wood cells are consumed.
